Holiday Safety Tips



Please stay safe as you decorate and celebrate this holiday season. Here are a few safety tips to keep in mind:

- Inspect electrical decorations for damage before use.
- Do not overload electrical outlets.
- Never connect more than three strings of incandescent lights.
- Keep live trees fresh by watering daily.
- Use battery-operated candles.
- Keep combustibles at least three feet from heat sources.
- Protect cords from damage.
- Check decorations for certification label.
- Stay in the kitchen when something is cooking.
- Turn off, unplug, and extinguish all decorations when going to sleep or leaving the house.

Reminder: Sanitation Information



Regular trash collection service will run one day behind for the weeks of Dec. 24 and Dec. 31. However, recyclables and bagged yard waste collection will not be affected.

The clamp and leaf vacuum trucks will not operate on Christmas Eve (Monday, Dec. 24, 2018), Christmas Day (Tuesday, Dec. 25, 2018), and New Year's Day (Tuesday, Jan. 1, 2019).

Fireworks Information

The City of Doraville follows the fireworks state law. Generally, throughout the year residents may display fireworks on certain days from 10 a.m. to 11:59 p.m. During the New Year's holiday, residents may display fireworks between the hours of 10 a.m. on December 31 to 1 a.m. on January 1. Once celebrations come to an end, whether you are a resident or a business, please be a good neighbor by cleaning up any fireworks debris. Don't leave trash because small children or pets can easily digest the chemicals and it makes the street, sidewalks, yards and other areas unsightly.

Below are fireworks safety tips from the National Safety Council:



- Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol
- Never allow young children to handle fireworks
- Older children should use them only under close adult supervision
- Anyone using fireworks or standing nearby should wear protective eyewear
- Never light them indoors
- Only use them away from people, houses and flammable material
- Only light one device at a time and maintain a safe distance after lighting
- Never ignite devices in a container
- Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks
- Soak unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding
- Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire
