### STATE OF THE CITY NEXT FRIDAY Don't Miss Doraville's Assembly Yards Event!

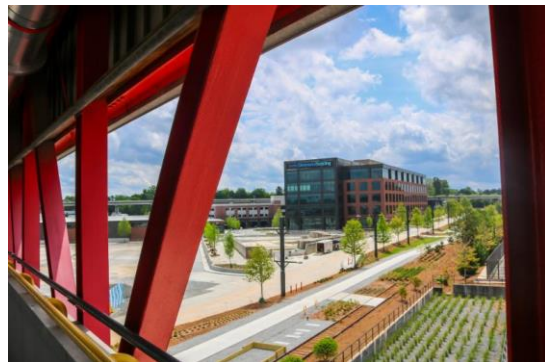
#### Mayor Pittman to Highlight Significant Projects That Are Shaping the City's Future
