## Take Extra Care With Safety Around Gas Pipeline Markers

Because gas pipelines are buried underground, pipeline markers and warning signs are used above ground to indicate their general location. These markers are placed wherever needed to indicate the presence of a pipeline, including at river, railroad and street crossings and in other heavily congested areas.

Be familiar with permanent markers that indicate the material transported in the pipeline; the name of the pipeline operator; and a telephone number where the operator can be reached in an emergency. Call 811 before you dig, no matter how big or small the project is.

## PDK Airport Enters Second Phase of Master Plan Process

DeKalb Peachtree Airport (PDK), which has an annual economic impact of \$90 million and is home to more than two dozen businesses, including 12 flight schools, is entering the second phase of its 2040 master plan process.

The 730-acre PDK is studying airfield capacity (currently at 58 percent but projected to be 80 percent by 2040); its most demanding aircraft (Gulfstream 550 and King Air 90); airfield safety requirements (runway length, width and lighting); landside improvements (storage, parking, fire station, museum, administration building); and airport support facilities.
